ELECTION OF DEPUTY VICE-CHANCELLOR (ACADEMIC) AND DEPUTY VICE-CHANCELLOR (RESEARCH INNOVATION AND PARTNERSHIPS)

This is to inform the University community that the Office of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) has become vacant with effect from Thursday, 19 January, 2017.

Moreover, the Governing Council, at its meetings of Thursday and Friday, 23 and 24, February, 2017 has approved the new position of Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Innovation and Strategic Partnerships) (RISP).

In accordance with the provisions of Section 4(2) and (3) of Decree No. 11 of 1993, (now Act 11 of 1993):

“(2) Where a vacancy occurs in the post of Deputy Vice-Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor shall forward to the Senate a list of two candidates for each post of Deputy Vice-Chancellor that is vacant.

(3) The Senate shall select for each vacant post one candidate from each list forwarded to it under sub-section (2) of this section and forward his name to Council for confirmation.”

Sequel to the foregoing, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor A.I. Olayinka, *FAS*, has proposed the following persons for election to the post of Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) and Deputy Vice-Chancellor (RISP), respectively:

Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic)

1. Professor A.A. Aderinto – Department of Sociology, Faculty of the Social Sciences
2. Professor O. Fagbola – Department of Agronomy, Faculty of Agriculture and Forestry.

Deputy Vice-Chancellor (RISP)

1. Professor Olanike K. Adeyemo – Department of Veterinary Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine.
2. Professor M.O. Oyewola – Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Technology.

An election into the posts will, therefore, hold during the next regular meeting of Senate on **Wednesday, 8 March, 2017.**
