1.	2017-2018 Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant Programme	<p>Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant (FLTA) programme is a nine-month non-degree programme funded by the U.S. Department of State, Washington D.C., and administered by the Institute of International Education (IIE) in New York.</p> <p>Grant Benefit: The grant covers the grantee's round trip airfare to the U.S., a settling-in allowance, monthly stipend, housing allowance, health insurance, and tuition scholarship for their coursework. Provisions will be made for participants to attend a Fulbright FLTA Summer Orientation in the United States prior to beginning their programme. 2.	2017/2018 Fulbright African Research Scholar Programme.	<p>The Fulbright Senior Scholar Programme is funded by the United States Department of State and administered by the Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES). It offers senior faculty members from universities in Africa, including Nigeria, the opportunity to conduct research at U.S. institutions for a minimum of three (3) months and a maximum of nine (9) months.</p> <p>The Fulbright Scholar Programme provides two types of grants:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Senior Research Programme which enables selected candidates to pursue individual research projects; 2. The Professional Development Programme which allows senior faculty members to spend three (3) to five (5) months at an American university or college to pursue professional interests and consult with colleagues in their field. All applicants are required to specify which of the two grant categories they wish to be considered. The 2017-2018 Fulbright Junior Staff Development (JSD) Programme	<p>JSD is a research programme funded by the U.S. Department of State, and administered by the Institute of International Education (IIE) in New York.</p> <p>The JSD programme is designed primarily to strengthen African universities by giving grantees the opportunity to conduct doctoral research in the United States. It offers young and exceptionally promising faculty members in select Nigerian universities the opportunity to conduct doctoral research at U.S. academic or research institutions for a maximum of nine (9) months.</p> <p>Grant Benefit: The grant covers the grantee's round trip airfare to the U.S., a settling-in allowance, monthly stipend, housing allowance, books-and-supplies allowance, and computer allowance.
